

What you should bring.

The Village apartments are fully furnished and stocked with linen, bedding, blankets, washing, kitchen appliances and utensils.

We suggest that you bring with you some essential items to make your stay as comfortable as possible.


These items include toiletries, appropriate clothing (Adelaide weather can be very hot and dry in the summer and cold, wet and windy in the winter), and identification such as your drivers licence and bank cards.

Where we are located.

The village is situated at 39 Folland Avenue, Northfield. There is a medical super clinic, local supermarket, deli, DVD store and post office within walking distance.

A new medical super clinic has recently opened near the village providing bulk billed GP, psychology, physiotherapy, pilates and pathology collection services.

A shopping centre with a hairdresser, supermarket, chemist and various stores and cafés are located a short five minute drive from the village.





About the Village.

The Bridgestone Australia Leukaemia Foundation Village is a comprehensive purpose built support facility for people living with blood cancer.

The village is located in Adelaide's north-east. It is within eight kilometres of both the *Women's and Children's Hospital* and the *Royal Adelaide Hospital* and 12 kilometres from the *Queen Elizabeth Hospital*, allowing children and adults easy access to treatment. There are two distinct points of difference about the Leukaemia Foundation's village from other accommodation providers:

- The Village is provided at no cost to people with blood cancer and their families;
- The Village accommodation includes on-site support services for residents.



Staying at the Village.

The 15 two and three-bedroom apartments are all high quality and fully self contained allowing flexibility in accommodating families.

Furniture and fittings are comfortable and provide an easily managed infection control environment. All units offer disability access and private individual courtyards.

Facilities for residents.

Support centre - blood cancer support staff are on-site.

Study room - computer facilities for patients and families.

Gymnasium - for patients and families to exercise, aiding recovery and to assist with general well-being.

Games room - a communal area where residents and families can play, watch television and meet others in a relaxed atmosphere.

Auditorium - a convenient space for seminars, education sessions and meetings.

Transport service - operating out of the Village support centre, this service provides residents with comfortable and clean transport to and from their place of treatment.

Landscaped garden - residents can enjoy the Village community in a safe and relaxing environment landscaped with low-allergen plants.

Secure - off street parking and swipe card access to facilities ensuring the Village is safe and secure.
